All EHCP children have support.

A further EHCP request has been submitted for a child who is educated out of year in Year 1

- Kathy, Faye and Portage are working on an EHCP for a child in Reception.
- We now have two children on Child Protection (CP) register.
- One further child is having a single assessment completed by Children's Social Care (CSC), and we await an outcome.
- Gemma is booked to go to DSL Network on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> November. This enables any current issues/information to be shared.
- Gemma attended the Governors Assessment Presentation in October to present current SEND data.
- Two staff in Year 3 have attended training on epilepsy.
- Speech and Language are due to come into school and teach Year 1 staff how to best support a child with delayed processing.
- Speech and Language have trained a support in Year 2 to deliver interventions around delayed processing.
- Gemma has updated the asthma register in conjunction with Jayne Galloway. This has allowed us to identify which parents to invite to an asthma and anaphylaxis training course, taking place on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> November in the hall to provide them with support.
- Jayne Galloway has updated the Epi -pen awareness Information board in the staff room.
- All teachers and TA's are to complete the asthma and anaphylaxis training online and supply Charlotte B with their certificates.

- Due to concerns about a child's asthma, a referral is being made to the school nurse to seek advice for the parent. It appears unmanaged with the child being admitted to hospital and having to be kept inside at lunch time, despite taking his inhaler. We have been informed that he has not been prescribed with a preventative inhaler.
- The Year 5 child who was referred to the school nursing team for hearing difficulties has now been seen at the hospital and is due to have a second follow up appointment for more testing.
- A child in Year 1 has been referred to the school nurse for eating difficulties. It has been identified from this that he is displaying autistic tendencies. The school nurse advised parents to seek advice from the GP who is now referring him to CAMHS.
- The ASD (Autism spectrum disorder) arranged for a staff meeting in December has had to be postponed due to community event.
- 3 annual reviews of EHCPs have taken place.
- CAMHS has implemented a new intervention with Noah's Ark in relation to identifying and supporting children who may struggle with the transition to high school. 7 children have been identified by Year 6 staff and referred with parental permission. This will take place on a 1:1 basis at school.
- The Hearing impairment social intervention group are using school as a venue to hold their group. This will take place every Wednesday from 2.15pm – 4pm. They are very grateful to school for hosting. 2 children from Parkinson Lane attend.
- Gemma attended an external services networking event in October. It has been identified that Ian Wood is now Parkinson Lane's contact for CAMHS.
- A year 5 child was referred to CAMHS with parental consent, however, when CAMHS contacted the parent they minimised concerns and therefore the referral was rejected.
- Kathy is attending a meeting at Ravenscliffe for a an EHCP child whose parents are considering it as a possible secondary school.
- It has been highlighted that staff also need to make the office, Jayne and other members of staff aware if they have any allergies/medical conditions themselves. This is to ensure that appropriate actions can be taken should any issues arise.
